GOAL

To strengthen the capacity on preventing and controlling Tuberculosis in line with the most updated, evidence-based and internationally-recognized policies and guidelines.

METHODOLOGY

The course includes:

- brief review of WHO up to date recommendations
- work in consilium
- group work on case management
- study of cases provided by participants
- visits to penal institutions for familiarization with organization of TB Control in penitentiary facilities.

CONTENT OF THE COURSE

- WHO Global strategies and targets for TB prevention, treatment and control.
- Diagnostic algorithms. Rapid tests for diagnosis of TB and DR-TB.
- Interpretation of genotypic and phenotypic results.
- Risk of development, diagnosis and treatment of TB infection.
- New approaches and strengthening of DS and DR TB management skills
- Strengthening skills of management of tuberculosis in children and adolescents.
- TB diagnosis and treatment for TB/HIV/HCV co-infected patients.
- Management of adverse events.
- Monitoring and evaluation of TB services.

OUTCOME

By the end of the course, participants will have a better understanding on effective TB-control interventions management in health facilities, including implementation of the up-to-date methods of diagnostics and treatment regimens.

TRAINING LANGUAGE

The course language is Russian and English.
